Welcome, we are glad you have joined us in Worship this morning. Please join us for morning tea after the service. **Luke 18:9-14** ⁹To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everyone else, Jesus told this parable:

¹⁰"Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector.

¹¹The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people-robbers, evildoers, adulterers-or even like this tax collector.

¹²I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get.'

¹³"But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.'

¹⁴"I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

Discipleship Thought: Today's parable of Jesus brings a confronting image: the tax collector, a most corrupt, greedy and unethical person; or the Pharisee, a respected pillar of the righteous living? What do we hear? What nuance is coming to us behind these words? These two people are living in ordinary occupations of the times. They are doing exactly what everyone knows and expects. How then shall we live? We could all reach into our dreams and recall a person who lived in humility, with justice, created peace and loved all who came their way. Perhaps they are a quiet member of the community. Or possibly a colleague, or a leader whom you met. Pharisee or tax collector? What does the parable teach us? What vision does Jesus offer us to reflect upon about our everyday life? Sit for a while, in the Spirit. Share with God your yearnings of being a child of God. Let the vision of all that could be in you, unfold in this sacred time and space. How then shall you live?

Prayer: O God, it is right for us to praise you and keep our promises to you.

Happy are those you bring to live in your sanctuary.

We shall be satisfied with the good things of your house, the blessings of your sacred temple.

You do wonderful things to save us.

People all over the world, across the distant seas, trust in you.

You set the mountains in place by your strength, showing your mighty power.

You calm the roar of the seas and the noise of the waves.

You calm the uproar of the peoples.

The whole world stands in awe of the great things that you have done.

Your deeds bring shouts of joy from one end of the earth to the other.

You show your care for the land by sending rain, making it rich and fertile.

You fill the streams with water; you provide the earth with crops.

Everything shouts and sings for joy. Amen

Read the Luke Bible Reading on Page 2 of 'The Window'.

We all dislike people who blow their own trumpets, although sometimes we may be in awe of them. Jesus too deplored such behaviour and was never in awe of those who practised it. Let us open ourselves to Jesus, allowing him to see what is in our hearts.

We don't always spot other people's inner motivation because we're so dazzled by their outer appearance. But Jesus made it clear that it's our inner being which is most important and an inner being which is loves only itself is not right before God.

In this story, Praxis the pixie whose skin changes colour according to his moods is dazzled by a newcomer to the pixie village.

Praxis Is Apple Green - Praxis the pixie, whose skin changed colour according to his moods, was gleaming. He was rather a lovely shade of apple green and he was gazing with awe and delight at Raymondo. Raymondo had recently joined the pixie village, but he was unlike any pixie Praxis had ever seen.

nothing but love for him, Praxis. "Oh," he said. "I think I begin to see. You mean, Raymondo only loves himself?"


