

For the youth and young at heart Children's Liturgy and Story

Luke 17:5-10 (NRSV) - The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!"

⁶The Lord replied, "If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.

⁷"Who among you would say to your slave who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field, 'Come here at once and take your place at the table'?

⁸Would you not rather say to him, 'Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink'?

⁹Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded?

¹⁰So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, 'We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!' "

His friends and followers said to Jesus, "Increase our faith!" Let us explore faith and ask that he might increase our faith too.

Story: A mustard seed is about the size of a grain of rice, but grows into a tree large enough and leafy enough to offer shade. We only need about as much faith as grain of rice to make all the difference to our lives.
