Discipleship Thought: The recent film *Just Mercy* is based on the book and life of US lawyer Bryan Stevenson, who has spent his career defending children sentenced to the death penalty.

In one interview, Stevenson explains why he wrote the book. "One of the things I just wanted people to understand is we can't continue to have a system of justice defined by error and unfairness and tolerate racial bias and bias against the poor and not confront what we are doing to individuals and to families and to communities and to neighbourhoods."

Today's Gospel reading offers us a way of dealing with conflict that looks toward restoration, dignity and wholeness for all involved – individuals and their communities - a way that emerges from Jesus' concern for 'little ones' and the one in a hundred.


And up in heaven God smiled, for the job had been well done by all.
